Over the Summer we are very busy working closely



MFSC History 1950 — 2015



In the spring of 1951, the club presented its first carnival, called "Ice Capers" under the direction of club coaches, Velma Lillicrop and Genneetta Bull. Guest soloists included Paul Bull, Charles Kiel and Pauline Bull of Silver Blades Skating Club; Joan DePass of Oakville Skating Club and Wanda Beasley from the Granite Club. In addition, Paul Bull

of Silver Blades teamed up with Marilyn McFadden of the Granite Club as well as Silver Blades Skating Club performing a Charleston Comedy number. Charles Kiel skated a pair number with Velma Lillicrop, as well as both coaches Genneetta Bull and Velma Lillicrop performing a pair number as Birds of Paradise. "Ice Capers" played to overflow

crowds and the practice of carnivals being presented has continued, with few exceptions, every other year throughout the club's history.

Tomken Twin Rinks was built in 1991, and a "new Home" for the club became a reality.

As the Club Grew.....

As the club grew additional ice time was secured at Cawthra Park and Huron Park Arenas and our skaters skated out of all three arenas until ice time was available at the Burnhamthorpe (Chic Murray) Arena built in 1973. Dixie Arena Gardens remained the club's "Home" with additional ice time at Burnhamthorpe until Dixie's demise as an arena in 1986, a long time calling it "Home" and a very nostalgic era for all those involved with the club for so many years; but all good things must come to an end. When Dixie Arena closed its doors, the club, while never really considering it "Home" as such secured most of their ice time at The Mississauga Valleys Arena built in 1975, retaining ice at Burnhamthorpe Arena and securing additional ice time at Erin Mills Twin Rinks, once again finding themselves spread three arenas. With time comes patience, and when Tomken Twin Rinks was built in 1991, a "new Home" for the club became a reality with additional ice time retained at The Mississauga Valleys Arena. When the new facilities were erected at Iceland in 1996, the club replaced its ice time at Mississauga Valleys with ice time at Iceland, Tomken Twin Rinks remaining our "Home", the two arenas provide all our ice requirements today.

This season, the 2016 Snowflake Skate Competition will be hosted by Mississauga Figure Skating Club, together with Skate Canada Central Ontario and held on January 9th, 2016 at Tomken Arena. This is an annual even that typically draws skaters and their families from the greater western Toronto area, including Oakville, Mississauga, West Toronto and Woodbridge.

It was in 1977, that Roger Mepham, President, initiated a change in the club's name of Credit Valley Skating Club; the dual purpose being to provide our skaters with a more identifiable "Home Base". No longer would our skaters be faced with puzzled looks and questions of who they were representing or where they

were from when competing. They would now have an explicit identity and being representative of our community. Hence, the Credit Valley Skating Club became known as The Mississauga Skating Club, ultimately revised to The Mississauga Figure Skating Club Inc. as it is known today; a club that we all can

be very proud of due wholly to many, many "volunteer" hours, (too numerous to even contemplate over sixty five years), by the great number of dedicated people who have served on the various Boards of Directors, as well as club members, giving of themselves from our humble beginnings to what we represent today. With almost full complement of Board Membership at the helm of the Club Today, we are looking towards to another 65 years of great success.

This year MFSC offered summer skating for our MFSC skaters. This new and exciting summer skating program was developed by our coaches and is called MFSC Cutting Edge Summer Skating Program. The program offered four weeks of figure skating camp this

summer held at the Vic Johnston Community Centre during the month of July. The camp hosted MFSC StarSkaters and advanced CanSkaters (passed Stage 3). Each camp day included a combination of warm-up, on-ice, off-ice training and group activity sessions.

Over 80 registrations were enrolled in this program averaging over 20 skaters per week. The Skaters had a great time, making new friends and enhancing their skating skills.

Based on great results this summer MFSC is hoping to offer this program annually.
